
On Boxing Day, our '05 Road Captain, Dick Sackett, gathered this fine gang.




He lead out east with Nanna Frye left, ready to ride, and Denis Duchene on his yellow Suzuki already in line.










John Collins has planned an Alpine ride this spring with two sons-in-law, and he came down out of the mountains of Colorado to make sure they
